A check on our records have shown the following -


- 1. Periods of Service with Division of National Mapping.
  - (a) 28th November 1949 to 26th May 1954.
  - (b) 23rd April 1956 to 3th July 1959.
- Phases of Work involved in your Matienal Mapping Service.

Phases of technical work on which you were engaged during your service with Division of National Mapping were -

- (a) All aspects of recommaissance, beaccning, observing and computation on the 1st and 2nd Order triangulation chains between -
  - (i) Victoria and Tasmania, across Bass Strait.
  - (ii) Darwin to Pine Creek.
  - (iii) Port Lincoln to Whyalla, on Eyre Peninsula.
- (b) Examination and marking up of aerial photos in the field; long range barometric heighting; astronomical determination of latitudes and longitudes for map control all over remote areas of Central and NE and NW Australia.
- (c) Compilation of photo mosaic sheets.
- (d) Compilation of 4 mile Planimetric maps.
- (e) Initial investigation with Chief Surveyor of computations and adjustments of tellurometer traverses and trilateration net works in early use of the tellurometer in Australia.
- (f) In charge of geodetic and topographical computations in the Melbourne office of the Division of National Mapping through the second period of your service with this Division.
- 3. Your combined field experience and advanced mathematical knowledge were specially helpful to this Melbourne office of National Mapping during its formative years.


